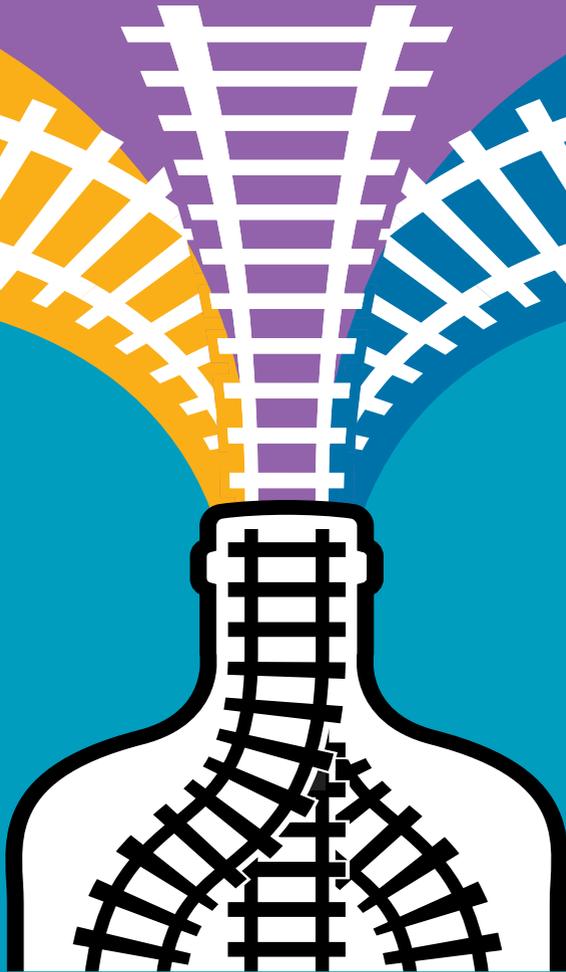


Public consultation

Unblocking the Croydon bottleneck

We are consulting on major proposals to unblock the Croydon bottleneck to provide more reliable, more frequent and faster services for passengers on the Brighton Main Line.

In 2018 we held our first public consultation on CARS. The detailed feedback we received has been used to further develop our designs, and common concerns have been considered and factored into our construction programme.

From Monday 1 June we will continue with our second round of public consultation, where you will have the opportunity to have your say on our plans and designs for unblocking the bottleneck at Croydon.

In light of recent government advice, we have postponed the face-to-face public consultation events which were scheduled for June. You will be able to provide feedback online, over the phone or by post.
